## Say hello to our special guest

We are joined by an inspirational guest speaker, Carina will join us to share her story.

#### Carina Nicholson

Carina's personal story with cancer began in 2017, when she discovered a small, hard lump in her breast, and her life took an unexpected turn. After receiving her breast cancer diagnosis, she underwent surgery, followed by two rounds of chemotherapy and six weeks of radiation in Adelaide, where she stayed at Cancer Council SA's Greenhill Lodge.

Then just two years ago, her life was turned upside down again when she was diagnosed with stage 4 breast cancer that had spread to her bones.

"Now it's the unknown; they can't give me a timeline. The last two years have been a hard time for my girls and my family to go through, but we try to have a positive mindset to make the most of the situation," Carina said.

"There's no way I would have been able to afford six weeks of staying in Adelaide during radiation therapy without Greenhill Lodge. By raising funds and taking part in Relay For Life, we are helping to ensure that these services that I've benefited from will continue to be there for other regional people going through cancer, long after I'm gone."

All the money raised through the 2023 Riverland Relay For Life will help Cancer Council SA fund vital prevention, research and support services, including our Greenhill Lodge accommodation, which in the past year has provided 27,500 nights of accommodation for regional South Australians travelling to Adelaide for life-saving cancer treatment.



## Things you should know about...

#### "It's about a community that takes up the fight..."

- 1. This is α non smoking event.
- 2. This event is Alcohol in moderation until 12pm Saturday only.
- 3. Sunscreen wil be available at various locations for your use. Please be sunsmart.
- Please ensure your team's belongings stay within the boundary of your campsite and do not impede the track in any way.
- Team Captains are responsible for the actions of their team members and their families/friends.
   A responsible adult must accompany people under the age of 18 attending the event.
- 6. One team member must be on the track with the team baton at all times.
- Friends or relatives may accompany a designated walker/runner but when they are doing so, their laps are not credited to the team. The same rule applies when more than one team member is on the track at the same time

- Lap counters will count laps based on the amount of laps your baton does (not Individuals). Make sure your baton can be seen as you pass the lap counting tent.
- The track is for all participants. Walking participants are requested not to impede the progress of runners.
- 10. The walking and running directions will be reversed periodically.
- 11. Teams are requested to mark their tents with the name of their team or team banner.
- Participants are responsible for the safety of their belongings—you are advised not to leave valuables unattended.
- All youth and school teams to have a supervisor over the age of 25 (unless parents caring for their own children) present for the entire duration of the event.




